#### Welcome - 10:02 am

- One previous informal meeting, 11/5/2022, 3 attendees (minutes incorporated here)
  - Specific pedestrian concerns may necessitate a distinct planning committee
  - Pedestrian safety currently falls under Traffic and Parking and/or Bicycling and Shared Path Advisory Committee
  - City needs to consider removing parking that abuts/obscures crosswalks
- 7 attendees, including one long-term Salem resident, one former Salem resident now in Beverly, and one Salem city councillor (Ward 6 - Megan Stott - new CC president), and the commissioner of the Salem Commission on Disabilities (David Moisan)
- Collected contact information for internal email list not for distribution
- Informal poll of attendees ~50% felt unsafe while walking over the past week, 100% percent of attendees felt unsafe walking at some point in the last month
- New term codified in MA legislature by Charlie Baker this week "vulnerable road user" covers all road/sidewalk users who are not protected by a car: pedestrians, cyclists, mobility-impaired people, people with children, people with dogs, runners, etc. very broad category but important as it encompasses a large portion of population, sets stage for action
  - Motorized scooters are a tough intermediate should be used in road or multi-use paths, using on sidewalks is a major risk to pedestrian safety, must have a city ordinance allowing sidewalk use in MA - and must yield right-of-way to pedestrians in all circumstances

# Specific incidents/locations that feel unsafe

### WALK SIGNAL BROKEN AT WASHINGTON/NEW DERBY FOR SEVERAL WEEKS

- o Stuck on red "Don't Walk" hand and number 20 for weeks
- Several attendees reported on SeeClickFix, no repair
  - Reinforced SeeClickFix to flag issues, both website and mobile app
- o Immediate safety concern, Councillor Stott to flag for escalation ASAP
- Bridge St and St. Peter St this morning, crossing Bridge signal mismatch, pedestrian wanted 5 minutes for light to change and then when the traffic light changed, the walk light did not, crossed anyway
- Lafayette Street marked crosswalks (no lights) near SSU often ignored, lit crosswalks have ambiguous signals (red/yellow), "stroad"
- Highland Avenue always a concern, recent fatality, recent walk audit by MA DOT
- Salem Community Life Center (Bridge Street) one long-term Salem resident uses
  the center but said specifically, "I hate going to the Community Life Center."
  Non-driver, pedestrian only, sidewalk leading to CLC from downtown does not exist,
  huge safety hazard. Center hosts events for many residents and could be much better
  utilized with better pedestrian/non-motor vehicle access (also currently fenced off).

- **Barton Square** behind Essex/Gulu, etc. seems to not really be a traveled road but more of a cut-through for parking, misleadingly unsafe for pedestrians
- Congress Street another "stroad," frequent road racing/speeding/motorcycles
- Washington St/Bridge St intersection always difficult to cross, esp. at night
- Better MBTA train station access from Peabody direction no sidewalks, have to go uphill to come back downhill, also stairs at station to Crescent Lot still out of service
- 465 bus discontinued in 2021, no real replacement, 435 not good substitute
- Salem Common/Washington Square identified during previous meeting

## What can we do as a group?

- Recommend identifying 2-3 key locations and targeting them for visibility in the early stages of this group, can extend to larger projects/areas as we gain steam
- Can request walk audits Councillor Stott provided helpful info
